BOT News

Kia ora from the Board,

As a board and indeed as a school community, I know we are all devastated at the news of 5-year-old Joanna Kong's tragic death from the injuries she sustained after being hit by a car in her school carpark last week. It is an absolute tragedy, schools and communities all over the country are carrying Pigeon Mountain Primary in our hearts.

It sadly highlights the dangers for our children around cars, carparks and roads. We each individually need to play our own part in keeping ALL of our children safe in and around our school. This means:

- The Kea Crossing is positioned on Fields Pde to ensure a safe place to cross with clear sight for small people crossing the road.
 Please be a good role model for our children with how & where you cross the road.
- Parking your car where you are not obstructing road corners or sight lines for those crossing at the Kea Crossing or the small side roads around our school.
- Park further away from school and walk to pick up your children. Even choosing to park around Nimstedt Ave and Gleanor Ave is a great idea. It is a short walk to school and helps to keep heavy traffic away from the Kea Crossing zone.
- Children can be unpredictable; we need to do all that we can as responsible adults to make the safest choices on their behalf.
- Our staff and parents out on duty are there to do all that they can to keep our children safe, please respect them in this role and do as they ask of you.

If we each take responsibility to try to park kindly, stay vigilant and keep our vehicles further away from the immediate school zone it will make the roads where our children walking are much safer.

Building Update

We are getting closer to the start of our new classrooms. We have been advised by the Ministry of Education that they are very close to finalising a contractor for the project and we should know who this is very soon. Once the contractor has been finalised we will have a start-up meeting with them, and I will keep you updated on timelines and progress.

A lot of work needs to be done to secure the building site before any work can commence and the safety of our children, staff and visitors will continue to be of the highest priority.

Year 6 Visit to Construction on Oteha Valley Road

Our Year 6 children have been invited to have a tour of the bridge and road construction that is happening on the other side of Oteha Valley Road. Dempsey-Wood is the company completing the work and they were keen for our older children to come and see progress on the work and have the opportunity to talk to the engineers about the project.

Once completed, this construction will help our children keep safe on their way to and from school, and will hopefully allow more of them to walk, bike or scooter to school, and help ease traffic congestion around our school.

Some of our Year 5 &6 children will be representing our school at the Northern Bays Cluster Swimming event to be held at the Millennium. It has been challenging for us selecting our swimmers for this event with two lockdowns. Good luck to all the children participating.

In weeks 1 and 2 of Term 2, we are delighted to welcome back Omar from New Zealand Dance. All children will have 2 weeks of dance lessons with Omar, and this will culminate in a couple of performances for parents- date and time to be advised. All of you who were able to come and watch the performances in Term 4 last year, will appreciate how much our children learn from this experience and how much they enjoy it. You will also remember that parents are invited to dance with the children at the end, so get practising now!

Term 2 Dates and Events

Term 2 will commence on **Monday 3rd of May at** 8:50am. It ends on **Friday 9 July**.

We have several exciting events happening in Term 2.

On **Friday 21 May** we will join with hundreds of other schools and organisations to celebrate Pink Shirt Day. This is a day that symbolises a stand against bullying. Children will be able to wear a pink shirt (or something pink) to school that day.

On **Friday 4th June** we have a Teacher Only Day. We have a facilitator, Tamsin Hanly, who is going to work with teachers on developing our understanding of NZ History from a Bi-Cultural perspective. From 2022, all schools are required to teach NZ History as part of their local curriculum. **Monday 7th June** is a public Holiday to celebrate Queens' Birthday weekend, so families can take advantage of the Teacher Only Day on Friday as well, to have an extended weekend with the family.



On **Thursday 10th June** we will hold our School Cross Country. We were unable to hold this last year due to Lockdowns and Alert Levels, so we are looking forward to being able to hold this in Term 2. Saving Day is **Friday 11 June**.

On **Tuesday 15th June**, our best Year 6 Mathematicians, and strategists, will compete against other North Shore and Rodney Schools at the Mathex Competition. We have 3 teams entered and Mrs Coote is busy preparing them for this.

Along with our Kiwisport Dance programme, we have a group of performers who are practising for the biannual Northern Bays Performing Arts show at the Bruce Mason Centre on Wednesday 16th June. Miss Harman and Mrs Craggs have held auditions and are going to work with the children who will represent our school, up until the show day. On that day we will also have some artwork on display at the Bruce Mason Centre.

Learning Conferences will be held on Wednesday 30 June and Thursday 1 July. School will finish at 1.00 p.m. to allow Conferences to start at 1.30 p.m. Booking information will be sent home closer to the time.

On **Friday 2 July**, our Kapa Haka will participate in the Oneroa Kāhui Ako Matariki Festival, being held at Long Bay College. This event was another casualty of COVID and Lockdowns in 2020, so we are very excited to be able to start preparing for this very important occasion.
