Matariki

Matariki is the Māori name for the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades (or Subaru in Japan). It rises in mid-winter and for many Māori, it heralds the start of a new year.

Traditionally, it was a time for remembering the dead, celebrating new life, and planting new crops. In the 21st century, observing Matariki has become popular again as a cross-cultural celebration. Kites, kai, balloons, and fireworks help mark the occasion. lwi across Aotearoa celebrate Matariki at different times according to when its return is observed from their rohe (area). To some iwi, the new year in midwinter was signalled by the dawn rising of Matariki (the Pleiades), while to others it was the rising of Puanga. Matariki or Puanga can be seen predawn in the north-east of the sky, just above the horizon from mid-June to early July.

We are going to be celebrating Matariki in our school during the week of 21 -25 June. Classes will be participating in Matariki Activities, and we are delighted to announce that our two Kapa Haka will perform. We are very fortunate to have two teachers in our school this year with skills to teach waiata to the children. Miss Harman works with our Year 1 & 2 Kapa Haka and Mrs Craggs works with our Year 3-6 Kapa Haka. We will confirm times of the performances so parents and whanau can come and watch.

We are inviting our Māori and Pasifika families to a breakfast hui on Wednesday 23 June as part of our Matariki celebrations.

Our Year 3-6 Kapa Haka will also perform at the Oneroa Kāhui Ako Matariki Festival at Long Bay College on Friday 2 July. We had to cancel this event last year due to COVID, so we are all looking forward to being able to see our children and the children from our Kāhui Ako schools perform also.


