New Classroom Block

I am sure you have all seen the signs outside our gates giving you a glimpse of what our new, 3 level, 18 classroom block is going to look like. It feels like we have been waiting forever for this project to start, and I am delighted to confirm that work will start on 12th July. Woodview Construction were the successful tenders for the project, and we look forward to working with them over the next 18 months – 2years.

The first things that you will see is a 'road' around the back of our field, which is for all the trades vehicles to access the construction site. This will be fenced off to ensure children are not able to enter the site. While the work is being carried out, it is essential that parents DO NOT drive up the Medallion Drive entrance at any time of the day, even if the gates are open. There will be large trucks and machinery moving around and we do not want any accidents or congestion occurring because parents are driving up the drive.

Once the classroom block is completed, the Ministry of Education will organise for the temporary classrooms (Rooms 21-24) to be removed, allowing us to develop that area into additional playing space for the children.

We have done a lot of work over the past two years on developing a model of collaborative practice for teachers working in the new spaces and we will continue to refine this.

We are very excited to finally have a start date for our new classrooms. I would like to thank George Dew and Justine Haves, two members of our Board of Trustees for their contribution over the past 3 years, into the planning and design of our new classrooms, helping ensure they are flexible and practical spaces as well as being a good 'fit' with our school environment.



Additional Garden and Play Area

As well as the new classrooms, we have some drainage work starting shortly on the grass area around the Year 3-6 Playground, as well as outside the MPR. These areas will then be covered with an artificial surface to make them able to be used all year round.

In the area next to the Year 3-6 playground there will be a garden with some seating, and this will be a very popular space for children during break times and parents after school and in the weekends.

This work will start in August, and it will mean the Year 3-6 playground will not be able to be used for a couple of weeks, but it will be worth it, when the area is completed.
