Keeping Ourselves Safe

Over the next few weeks our school will be teaching the Keeping Ourselves Safe programme. Keeping Ourselves Safe has been designed by the New Zealand Police Education Unit to give children the skills to cope in situations involving abuse. It has three overall aims:

- To develop and strengthen children's skills to keep themselves safe with other people
- To support and encourage abused children to get help from caring adults
- To make teachers and parents more aware of the need to keep children safe from abuse by adults or other children.

The first unit of Keeping Ourselves Safe, Knowing What to Do Me Mōhio Kia Pēhea, will be taught by your child's teacher, with help from the Local Police Education Officer as required.

To be successful, Keeping Ourselves Safe needs your help and support. For example, your child might have Home Book Activities to work on with you. You will also get a copy of a publication Keeping Kids Safer, which will give you information about child abuse.

It is important that you participate as much as possible and talk to your child about what they have been learning. This will help reinforce the messages the school is giving and help your child to use their new skills with confidence.

There will be a Responsible Adults Information Meeting in our school before the programme begins to address any questions or concerns you may have:

It is hard to believe we are in term 3 of 2021 already! What a busy year we have had, and (thankfully) reasonably settled for the moment as far as Covid alert levels are concerned, I think we are all enjoying that!

No doubt you will have noticed the road being installed around the edge of the playing fields to ensure safe access for the construction crews and equipment for the 18 classroom block construction. This has been a massive project for the Property Subcommittee of the Board with planning for this project starting well over 5 years ago. Thank you to previous members of the Board, Steve Newman and Marty Bamford for their contribution to this project. I would also like to thank the current Property Subcommittee, Justine Haves, Rose Neal, Sherryl Prangley (and myself). There have been many, many hours spent discussing and considering these learning spaces, thank you all for your time, commitment and contribution to this project. We had a small, emotional ceremony on the first day of term 3 to "break the ground" for the project. It feels pretty amazing to have finally reached this stage in the process and we look forward to the completion of this exciting new building hopefully in 2023.

Earlier in the year the Ministry of Education (MOE) did their appraisal of the school property to assess the current status of the buildings and investigate improvements needed and desired by the school. It's part of a 5 and 10 yearly assessment of the school property. We are very happy that as part of this review the MOE have agreed to install heating in the hall and extend the outdoor breakout spaces for Pod 1. We are delighted to be able to deliver these for our learners in the coming years.
