# **Staff Organisation**

We have finalised our staffing for 2022 and a full list of teachers, year levels and room numbers is attached. You will be able to log into Hero, our Student and Learning Management system on **Friday 10 December** to find out which class your child will be in next year and who their teacher will be.

We are unable to organise for children to meet their new teacher, before they leave for the holiday break, due to COVID restrictions. We know that some children may feel anxious about returning to school with a teacher they may not know and so this year all teachers will make a short video, introducing themselves and this will be uploaded to your child's 2022 SeeSaw class. You will be able to watch this after 15<sup>th</sup> December.

Organising children into classes is a very complex and important process. We use a software programme, designed by a NZ teacher, Pluto, to organise classes for the following year. Teachers input a range of data, including academic, behavioural, social, and other factors into the programme and we can then generate several different class options. Teachers and Senior Leaders look very closely at all placements to try to ensure we get the best possible placement for every child. Your child may not be in the same class as a best friend, but that will be for good reasons. Sometimes children are better to be in a different class to their friends to help ensure they learn to their best potential. They can still see friends at break times, after school and in the weekend.

We ask that you are positive when talking to your child about next year's class and teacher. We do not consider requests for class changes so please do not request a change of class or teacher for your child.

Children need to learn to relate to different people; teachers and children, and new classes are an opportunity to make new friends.

#### **Staff News**

Welcome: I would like to formally welcome Monique Harding who started as a Learning Assistant during Lockdown. Monique is going to be supporting children across classes and some of our English Language Learners.

#### **End of Year Class Awards**

#### New Classroom Update and Projects

**New Classroom Block:** During Level 4 all work on the new classroom block had to stop, but since we moved to Alert Level 3, the contractors have been very busy, making up for lost time. It is so good to see the building starting to take shape. Currently the expected finish time for the new classrooms is the end of February 2023, with removal of the portable classrooms, Rms 21-24 happening in June 2023. These dates are obviously 'best estimates', and as we know from the past two years, timelines and deadlines need to be flexible.

Drainage and new Playing surface and seating: The drainage work on the driveway side of Pod 1 is finished. We now have a porous concrete surface that enables this area to be used as additional outdoor learning spaces. We have plans to develop this further over the next couple of years- adding some seating and fencing around it.



The drainage work around the Year 3-6 playground and outside Rms 1-4 is finished. All of this area has an artificial grass surface, and some new seating and planting. It looks amazing, and it means that these areas can still be used after rainfall. They have only been finished for two weeks, but already have been well used by children on their days in school.



# **Upcoming Property Projects**

We have a number of other property projects starting soon, and all of these are going to enhance our school facilities and resources.

**Sandpit:** The sandpit by the Year 1&2 Playground has been out of action for almost two years and I am delighted to let you know that work on refurbishing this will be starting soon. I hope that it will be able to be finished for the start of 2022, as our young children in particular love to play in the sandpit, and it is an important part of our Learning through Play programme.

Heating in the Hall: Many of you will have sat in our school hall over winter, layered up, to keep out the cold. We have had heat pumps installed in there over the last week, so the days of freezing cold assemblies and gatherings are over!

Lino replacement in Pods 1,2, &3 toilets: Over the Christmas holiday break, the lino in Pods 1,2, &3 will be replaced, and hot water will be installed in the boys' handbasins. When the school was built in 2004, hot water was only put in the girls' handbasins.

# Vandalism/School Grounds in the Holidays

I would like to thank our Property Manager, Paul Taylor, for all his hard work on our school grounds. Most of you will not be able to appreciate how lovely

our school is looking, due to lockdowns, Paul has done a fantastic job of maintaining the grounds and gardens, with some help from Mr. Phil Hancock.

Over the Christmas holidays we ask you all to be detectives and help us to keep our school tidy and damage free so we can all enjoy it.

If you see anyone damaging our property, or dumping rubbish etc., please write down the vehicle registration plate if they are in a vehicle or get a photo of them so we can report this ongoing vandalism to the Police.

We are very proud of our school environment, and we need your help to keep our grounds and buildings in good condition and free from mindless vandalism.

We have regular checks and patrols from our security company, Simply Security, throughout the day and night and if you all help ensure that everyone respects our grounds and equipment, it helps all of us. Thank you for your support.

#### **Kiwisport Dance**

We are dancing again in 2022! We are really looking forward to welcoming back Omar from NZ Dance Curriculum, in February next year. All classes will have two weeks of dance with Omar, culminating in performances for parents (should COVID restrictions allow us to have parents on site in large numbers again). The school subsidises the cost of the dance lessons and parents are asked to pay \$20 per child for 10 lessons.



#### Activity Costs 2022

At the moment we are unable to confirm Activity costs for 2022, apart from Kiwisport. We hope to be able to let you know early in the year what activities we are planning and the costs for these, but the uncertainty of COVID related restrictions, means we have not confirmed any other activities yet.

## **Teacher Only Days 2022**

As part of the recent Accord between the Ministry of Education and the Primary Teachers' Union, NZEI, all Primary schools will have an additional 8 Teacher Only Days that needed to be taken before 30 June 2022.

The purpose of these days is to allow time for teachers to undergo professional development on all the changes coming into our Education System.

We had to postpone two of our planned Teacher Only Days in 2021 and we have rescheduled these for 2022, meaning in 2022 we have some additional days that the school will be closed for instruction. We have tried to align these with other schools in the Kāhui Ako, and attach them to existing long weekends, so that families may be able to take an extra family holiday for a couple of days.

On these days teachers will be involved in professional development sessions and activities.
