#### **COVID Update**

We have enjoyed seeing many of you back before and after school, and we appreciate your support in staying out of classrooms and pod spaces, while we still deal with COVID cases across the school. This term we have had positive cases among students each week, but not in large numbers. Our staff have been affected more this term than in Term 1, with several isolating because they are household contacts or have tested positive. Many other North Shore schools are experiencing the same and it has made getting relievers more difficult. On days where we can't find a reliever for a class we have been buddying that class up across the other classes in the same year level. Because classes have been doing a lot of teaching collaboratively this year, it has made it less disruptive when we have to split classes, as the teachers know the other children in the classes, and the children know them.

We have not had to make the decision to ask you to keep children at home, yet and we hope we can continue to manage COVID cases among the staff without having to do so, as it would be a last resort. However, if we had insufficient staff to safely have the school open, we may need to do that. In that scenario, teachers would flip to on-line learning again, so children could continue their learning at home, until staff numbers stabilised enough for us to re-open the school.

We would let you know via HERO if we needed to close the school for all classes or certain year levels, so please make sure you are signed up to HERO and check your notifications and notices daily.

#### Masks

We are strongly encouraging all children to wear a mask at school, and thank you for your support in ensuring your child has a mask.

Staff are all wearing masks and we ask that all parents/caregivers/family members wear a mask when you come into the school office.



#### Children's Birthdays

We know that all children love celebrating their birthdays but ask that you do not bring cakes, party bags, lollies for other children in the class. It is a lovely gesture but many parents do not allow their children to eat sweets/chocolates and we have several children with food allergies. Please keep birthday celebrations at home. Thank you.

#### Matariki

Matariki is the Māori name for the cluster of stars also known as the Pleiades (or Subaru in Japan). It rises in mid-winter and for many Māori, it heralds the start of a new year.

Traditionally, it was a time for remembering the dead, celebrating new life, and planting new crops. In the 21st century, observing Matariki has become popular again as a cross-cultural celebration. Kites, kai, balloons, and fireworks help mark the occasion.

Iwi across Aotearoa celebrate Matariki at different times according to when its return is observed from their rohe (area). To some iwi the new year in mid-winter was signalled by the dawn rising of Matariki (the Pleiades), while to others it was the rising of Puanga (Rigel in Orion). Matariki or Puanga can be seen predawn in the north-east of the sky, just above the horizon from mid-June to early July.

All classes are collaborating with another class in the school on some Matariki activities for two weeks. This is culminating in a Matariki Art Display in the hall on Friday 1 July. Our Kapa Haka will be performing at a Kāhui Ako Matariki event at Long Bay College on Thursday 23 June. This will be the first time this year our Kapa Haka has been able to perform and I know that they are looking forward to the celebration.

On Tuesday 28 June we have invited our Māori and Pasifika children to a special Matariki breakfast before school. Due to COVID restrictions, we are unfortunately not able to invite parents or whānau to this but hope to be able to have a whānau hui later in the year.

#### Whānau Fridays

Last year teachers loved being able to invite parents, family and whānau in to classes on a Friday from 8.50 – 9.20 a.m. on our Whānau Fridays. We are going to start this up again on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> June. To help reduce the number of adults in the school we are going to have 2 year groups only at a time.

On **Friday 10<sup>th</sup> June**, **parents of Year 1 & 2 children** will be invited by the teachers to come into classes and pods to see some of the wonderful learning activities your children are doing. This is not just for you to come and observe, we want you to participate and get involved. Your child's teacher will let you know what activities the children are going to be doing beforehand.

We look forward to seeing some of you in classes for Whānau Fridays.



#### **Teacher Only Days**

There are two Teacher Only Days coming up soon. We appreciate that Teacher Only Days are not always convenient for parents, but we hope that by tagging them to an existing long weekend, that some families may be able to have some extra family time.

They are on **Friday the 3<sup>rd</sup> of June and Monday 27<sup>th</sup> June.** These days are part of the Primary Teachers' Collective Agreement settlement with MOE. All schools need to have used the 8 days that were negotiated by 30 June 2022. We had days scheduled in 2021 but had to postpone these due to Lockdowns. On **Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June**, all teachers will be working at school on our collaborative practice and reviewing and planning new collaboration activities.

On **Monday 27 June** we have planned some Te Reo and Te Ao Māori PLD for staff to support our school-wide focus on improving Te Reo of our staff and children across the school.

Working face-face on professional development is essential for teachers to have time to review and learn new skills and share ideas to improve their practice and ensure consistency across year levels.

At this stage conferences will be held **on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> July.** 

#### **Mathex**

Mathex is a challenging and fast-paced mathematics contest where schools from across Auckland compete against each other in teams to answer questions as quickly as possible.

This year we will be represented by 3 teams of Year 5 & 6 students at our local Mathex event on June  $15^{th}$  at Northcross Intermediate.

Mrs England and Mrs Coote are currently working with our possible contenders on their maths knowledge and problem solving.

Last year we were the overall winning school for Mathex, with teams from Oteha Valley School coming 1st and 3rd out of over 40 schools from the North Shore and Hibiscus Coast. While it is great to win such a prestigious event, we acknowledge that competition is always very tough, and we wish our children all the best and hope they enjoy the competition and learn from the experience.


#### Supporting other children through Kindo


My name is Calvin Wootton from Future Basketball Academy. My team and I offer high quality basketball coaching to students 5-15 years+
