New Classrooms

We finally have received the 'green light' from the Design Review Panel on the design of our new 3 storey, 18 classroom block which will be constructed behind Rooms 21-24. These rooms are temporary classrooms and will be removed when the new block is completed.

We are still a long way off construction starting, and are hoping this will be in the middle of 2021, meaning the classrooms won't be ready until the end of 2022. We have a meeting with our Property manager from the Ministry of Education next month to look at some options for catering for our continual roll growth. Currently we have no 'spare' classrooms and have two Year 1 classes in what was the school Library.
